BISP Certificate Program: Inequalities and Social Justice

BISP Certificate Overview

The BISP Certificate in Inequalities and Social Justice is for visiting students who are interested in understanding how individuals, organizations, and society as a whole are affected by inequities and injustices. This pertains to subjects in the social sciences, professions serving people or working within organizations, and many other types of work impacting humans and culture in all societies across the globe.

Students pursuing this BISP Certificate will learn about key mechanisms and institutions in which individuals and groups are categorized, the power imbalances between them, and the causes and consequences of these inequities. Social structures that maintain and reproduce inequalities and social injustice are examined by looking at race, social class, gender and systemic forces within the broader institutions of families, neighborhoods, government, health, education, and the labor force, among others.
