The BISP Certificate in Education, Society and the Student is for visiting students who are interested in understanding how institutions in society and culture influence students and educational institutions. Students pursuing this BISP Certificate will learn about the connections between social, cultural, and behavioral factors and education institutions as well as key insights into how these factors impact students in different ways. Students will acquire a good foundation in understanding social inequalities and education disparities that exist throughout the world and how they affect various aspects of education.
